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Reporting requirements for PaMs

Each Party shall provide information on actions, policies and measures that support the implementation and achievement of its NDC, **focusing on those** that:

- have the most significant impact on GHG emissions or removals and those
- impacting key categories in the national GHG inventory.

This information **shall be presented in narrative and tabular format.**

Parties shall to the extent possible organize reporting by sectors (energy, transport, industrial processes and product use, agriculture, LULUCF, waste management and other)



Reporting requirements for PaMs

Information shall be provided the extent possible, in a tabular format

(a) Name;

- Parties may indicate whether a measure is included in the ‘with measures’ projections)

(b) Description;

- Additional information may also be provided on the cost of the mitigation actions, non-GHG mitigation benefits, and how the mitigation action interacts with other mitigation actions, as appropriate)
- Parties should identify actions, policies and measures that influence GHG emissions from international transport
- Parties should, to the extent possible, provide information about how actions, policies and measures are modifying longer-term trends in GHG emissions and removals

(c) Objectives;



Reporting requirements for PaMs

Information shall be provided the extent possible, in a tabular format

- (d) Type of instrument** (regulatory, economic instrument or other);
- (e) Status** (planned, adopted or implemented);
- (f) Sector(s) affected** (energy, transport, industrial processes and product use, agriculture, LULUCF, waste management or other);
- (g) Gases affected;**
- (h) Start year of implementation;** (note: not the year of adoption)
- (i) Implementing entity or entities.**



Reporting requirements for PaMs – „FX“

Each Party **shall provide, to the extent possible, estimates of expected and achieved GHG emission reductions** for its actions, policies and measures in the tabular format;

FX Provision - those developing country Parties that need flexibility in the light of their capacities with respect to this provision **are instead encouraged** to report this information.



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Reporting requirements for PaMs

To the extent available, each Party shall describe the methodologies and assumptions used to estimate the GHG emission reductions or removals due to each action, policy and measure.

This information may be presented in an annex to the BTR.



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Reporting requirements for PAMs

Parties with NDC that consists of mitigation co-benefits resulting from Parties' adaptation plan and/or economic diversification plan

 info of PAMS that contribute to co-benefits to be reported
